
IOWA FCCLA STATE/NATIONAL OFFICER CANDIDATE: INFORMATION

Requirements/Experience:

- Active and current membership in an affiliated chapter
- Minimum of one year of Family & Consumer Sciences classes
- Academically eligible and in compliance with good conduct according to local school policy
- Minimum of one module in Power of One
- Recommended by the chapter in accordance with this application
- Members may run for office in their 10th or 11th grade years

Offices and Duties:

All state officers will attend the meetings of the State Executive Council, share in program planning, assist with district activities, keep record of his/her activities using the Program of Work Completion Reports, attend the National Leadership Conference, and make visits as requested by new chapters.

President. The President will preside over all business meetings of the State Executive Council. S/he will also serve as Voting Delegate and attend the State President National Training at the National Leadership Conference. S/he will serve on the Iowa FCCLA Board of Directors and attend all telecalls and meetings.

First Vice President. The First Vice President will serve in the absence of the State President. S/he will promote participation in STAR Events and be knowledgeable of the events. S/he will serve as a STAR Events judge at the National Leadership Conference. S/he will serve as the assistant to the State STAR Event Coordinator.

Vice President of Finance and Records. The Vice President of Finance and Records shall keep accurate minutes of each State Executive Council meeting and submit these promptly to the State Adviser. S/he will also serve as Voting Delegate at the National Leadership Conference. S/he will also present the Financial Report to the State Delegation at State Leadership Conference.

Vice President of Parliamentary Law. The Vice President of Parliamentary Law will assist in conducting meetings in a businesslike manner using parliamentary procedure and compile a record of the year's happenings in a State scrapbook. S/he will also serve as Voting Delegate at the National Leadership Conference.

Vice President of Public Relations. The Vice President of Public Relations will lead the state-wide Peer Education Public Relations team by attending the Peer Education Officer Training, teaching their team members through an ICN Training, make follow-up contact at least once a month, monitor all projects submitted by members, submit a year-end summary report highlighting team success, and present awards to team members at State Leadership Conference. S/he will also serve as the National Connections Team representative at the National Leadership Conference.

Vice President of Families First. The Vice President of Families First will lead the state-wide Peer Education Families First team by attending the Peer Education Officer Training, teaching their team members through an ICN Training, make follow-up contact at least once a month, monitor all projects submitted by members, submit a year-end summary report highlighting team success, and present awards to team members at State Leadership Conference.

Vice President of Financial Fitness. The Vice President of Financial Fitness will lead the state-wide Peer Education Financial Fitness team by attending the Peer Education Officer Training, teaching their team members through an ICN Training, make follow-up contact at least once a month, monitor all projects submitted by members, submit a year-end summary report highlighting team success, and present awards to team members at State Leadership Conference.

Vice President of Student Body. The Vice President of Student Body will lead the state-wide Peer Education Student Body team by attending the Peer Education Officer Training, teaching their team members through an ICN Training, make follow-up contact at least once a month, monitor all projects submitted by members, submit a year-end summary report highlighting team success, and present awards to team members at State Leadership Conference.

Uniforms

- The dress code for official state and national events is the official red jacket and ascot/tie.
 - Ladies: FCCLA red jacket, white oxford button-down shirt, FCCLA ascot, black skirt, off-black panty hose, and black pumps.
 - Men: FCCLA red jacket, white button-down shirt, FCCLA tie, black dress slacks, and black dress shoes.
- The dress code for state executive council meetings is the official Iowa FCCLA red polo and black dress pants.
 - All state officer candidates are encouraged to order a red polo through the ordering form prior to State Leadership Conference. Polo orders are only placed twice a year, before FLR and before SLC.
- The official red jacket and tie/ascot is supplied by the Iowa FCCLA State Association.
- Each officer is responsible for keeping their uniform clean.
- If food/drink is spilled on the jacket/tie, dry cleaning costs will not be reimbursed.
